What is a Democracy ?

- The term derives from the Greek term *Demos kratein,* meaning the people rule.
- A Democratic government is a system which the people and the government are connected, where people have direct or indirect influence in which policies are implemented.
- According to Ellen Ginsby's "analyzing politics", a democracy consists of five components which include; participation, pluralism, protection, performance, and developmentalism.
