## INTRODUCTION

- The two most known parties that successfully run and are elected are the Democratic and Republican parties.

## HISTORY OF POLITICAL PARTIES

- A political party is "a group of voters organized to support certain public policies". The "aim of a political party is to elect officials who will try to carry out the party's policies" ("The Origins and Functions of Political Parties").
- In 1787 Alexander Hamilton among the "founding fathers" began the Federalist party, the first U.S. political party established. Eventually, an "anti federalist" party emerged calling themselves the Democratic-Republicans.
- Since this, the U.S. has adopted over 100 different political parties with some coming into power and others developing support and a following.

#### MAJOR POLITICAL PARTIES

- The purpose of political parties is to bring people together who hold similar core views about the government. Political parties allow people to identify with their core beliefs (supposedly) without direct monetary influence.
- The U.S. is run by a two party system commonly referred to as a "representative democracy" meaning citizens are to elect officials whom we most agree to represent our political views in government.
- Two most known parties that successfully run and are elected are the Democratic and Republican parties. It is not to say that other parties like the Green, Liberal, Socialist, etc. parties have no power or voice in government. They simply seem to never receive enough votes for any major nominations.
- Democratic Party: strong government with power to regulate business and industry in the public forum, separation of church and state, commonly favor affirmative action and gun control, etc.
- Republican Party: free market capitalism, free enterprise, business, strong national defense, social-conservative policies, and traditional values.
- Interest groups, or organizations of people with common goals for change in policy and legislation, also work together to lobby government, engage in political activities, educate public forums, and mobilize various public information. However, it may be argued that political parties establish a weaker foundation for these interest groups. Interest groups establish support through monetary suggestions and lobbying.

# WHY ARE POLITICAL PARTIES IMPORTANT?

- Political parties establish checks and balances, encourage voter participation, and establish view or group for people to relate with.
- The purpose of political parties is to create and maintain this system of checks and balances, meaning to
  prevent one group or party from acquiring too much power and authority leaving voters feeling not satisfied
  and secure.
- Political parties provide citizens with a diverse range of political theories to agree or disagree with. Political parties also provide an advantage to the American party system, leaving voters to feel stability and ease with a more moderate two-party system.
- Disadvantages to the political party system in the U.S. include regulations and boxed categories for voters to
  feel forced into as their beliefs may not fit into the "Democratic" or "Republican" option offered to voters.
  Individual thoughts may be forcefully shifted into group efforts that individuals don't agree with, leaving voters
  to feel dismissed and unheard leaving more room for corruption, debate, and disagreement rather than
  peaceful resolution.

## INTERVIEWS

- Interview 1: My father, 51, Republican: Found political parties to be absolutely necessary to electing officials and regulating federal government.
- Interview 2: My friend, 23, Hispanic Democrat: Stressed the importance of not trusting any government official but reluctantly admitted the importance of voting among younger generations to create change.
- Interview 3: My friend, 26, White Democrat: Found political parties to be
  necessary but stressed an importance for more equality in voting system, opening
  more categories and options for officials to rise in (not through Republican or
  Democratic funding sources). Believes in the importance of more regulated
  government with less power with women's rights and discrimination.

#### INTERESTING THOUGHTS

- I find political parties to be a crucial part of the political agenda. Though I do find the two-party system limiting and unequal when expressing individual views. As times change and issues grow I think it is important that voters opinions not be confined to only two boxes really offered when electing major officials.

- Choosing the right political party and registering to vote is an important role to exercise
